Breaking New Ground

The Child Development Centre (CDC) and the Northern Health Authority (NHA) are jointly developing a new initiative that promises to provide substantial assistance to children with special needs and their families.

In our last newsletter (www.cdcp.org/documents.shtml) we introduced our joint development of a service network for children with special needs, but how will it benefit the region's children? Three years ago the CDC and NHA integrated their intake processes for preschool children with special needs. This integration proved highly beneficial by increasing the level of collaboration and communication between our organizations. This improved both overall services and the individual service plans we develop for the children we serve. The integration also facilitated improved access services; families can receive services from both organizations by filling out one set of registration and authorization documents.

The network will expand on these benefits. It will also be the first of its kind in BC, linking several child development, health and education providers.

The project's first major milestone is scheduled for completion in October when both organizations upgrade their electronic client information systems.

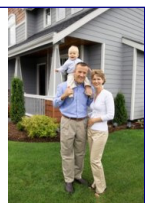
